
Q: Why hire a Prodigy Program student as an intern?

CODE SCHOOLS Timeline

July-August: Summer Bootcamp HTML, CSS, JavaScript Sept.-Oct.: Pre-Work Bootcamp

October-June: On-site Placements
Students work at their sites afterschool on weekdays,
approximately 6-10 hours per
week depending on site.

July-August: Optional Full-time
Summer work.

Employment

Student interns receive human resources and training support from our offices as well, and staff coordinators work with students and employers to assure maximum productivity and satisfaction on both ends. Code in the Schools assumes the responsibility as employer of record for all student interns. Our offices handle all wage and liability costs throughout the entire year. Employers are asked to make a \$5,000 to \$10,000 tax deductible donation to cover the costs of the student. Code in the Schools subsidizes the full cost of the program through grant funding, and employers should contact the Code in the Schools' office for specific financial arrangements.
